

## Training Offer 2026 :

### I. July and August Intensive Sessions

DEAC will offer two intensive summer sessions in 2026:

July 2026 : from July 5 to 30, 2026; placement tests from June 28 to 30, 2026.

August 2026: from August 2 to 27, 2026; online placement tests in July.

Three programs are offered.:

-Program 1 : Modern Standard Arabic and Egyptian Arabic dialect; classes five days a week, from Sunday to Thursday.

-Program 2 : Modern Standard Arabic; classes four days a week, from Monday to Thursday.

-Program 3 : Egyptian Arabic dialect (for students who can read Arabic; all our materials are in Arabic); classes from Sunday to Wednesday:

- 4 days per week for beginners.

- 3 days per week for intermediate and advanced levels.

Each session begins with placement tests (written and oral comprehension and expression) in Modern Standard Arabic (Fusha) and Egyptian Arabic dialect. Students are then divided into three groups: Dialect, Fusha, and Grammar.

Classes take place from Sunday to Thursday, starting at 8:30 a.m. Each session lasts 2 hours, with a one-hour lunch break. The courses are held at the French Institute of Mounira, in downtown Cairo.

## II. September Semi-Intensive Session (New!)

Starting in September 2026, DEAC will launch a new semi-intensive session designed to provide an accelerated introduction for students enrolling in the first semester or full-year programs.

This session is **exclusively for absolute beginners** and includes 48 hours of Fusha and dialect lessons, along with 2 days focused on immersion in Cairo's Pharaonic and Arab-Islamic culture. It provides students with the following advantages:

- Accelerate learning to start the first semester or full-year program at an A1 level.
- Benefit early from immersion in the city of Cairo through guided visits included in the program (2 days visiting the Grand Egyptian Museum and Cairo's Arab-Islamic districts).
- Take the time to settle in Cairo and complete various administrative procedures related to the stay (with DEAC's assistance).



### III. Preparation Session for MEAE Arabic Competitive Exams

This **20-hour** program is offered entirely online and runs only from July to September. Classes take place over 5 days, from Sunday to Thursday, with 4 hours of instruction per day and a 30-minute break between two 2-hour sessions..
